






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OVERVIEW

The Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship (CMDA) is ideal if you are a professional manager who takes lead responsibility for people, projects, operations and services to deliver long-term organisational success.

The course is suitable for professional managers from the private, public or third sectors, and all sizes of organisations. This apprenticeship has been designed to provide access to development opportunities for as wide a range of individuals as possible.

The course would be beneficial if you are at the start of your career wishing to become a professional manager and achieve Chartered Manager status,

or if you have already developed practical experience but wish to develop your theoretical understanding of management skills further.

The CMDA has been developed by a group of employers, in partnership with a number of higher education institutions and the Chartered Management Institute (CMI). Under this scheme, on completion of the apprenticeship you will achieve a BA (Hons) in Leadership and Management and become a Chartered Manager. You will need to demonstrate where you have taken responsibility to deliver long-term organisational success.

This programme is based on the BA (Hons) Leadership and Management.





TEACHING AND SUPPORT

You will be taught by an experienced teaching team whose expertise and knowledge are closely matched to the content of the modules on the course. The team includes academic staff. professional practitioners with industry experience, and technicians. Postgraduate students undertaking teacher training may also contribute to the teaching of seminars under the supervision of the module leader. WHAT WILL I LEARN?

The Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship is an exciting work-based route towards developing professionally competent Chartered Managers. It includes three parts:

- Work-based learning which means that as an apprentice you will be in paid employment for the duration of your apprenticeship, and will receive on-the-job training and support
- The completion of the BA (Hons) Leadership and Management at UCSD
- Through both of the above, you will be able to acquire knowledge and skills, and prepare for the End Point Assessment, which has the assessment for Chartered Manager embedded

DEGREE QUALIFICATION

The BA (Hons) Leadership and Management top-up degree places a strong emphasis on management and leadership principles, and provides a challenging curriculum which addresses concepts including the values, principles and rules within the sector.

The degree has been designed to help you develop an understanding of management and leadership competencies based on an understanding of decision-making, management development and strategic leadership.

You will benefit from our excellent links with local industries, and will work directly with employers to enhance your professional and employability skills through live projects, research projects, industry visits, and expert guest speakers.

The programme will be delivered through a variety of methods, including lectures, student-led seminars, research projects and analytical assessments.

MODULES

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT CONCEPTS

This module provides an overview of the role of leadership and management within organisations, and the differences between the two concepts. You will explore the relationship of leadership and management to a range of processes at individual, team, organisational and national level, adopting multiple perspectives and highlighting key skills such as communication.

The module will develop your understanding of the theories and practices of management, while also critiquing the multi-dimensional role of leadership. A range of techniques will be explored to aid with decision making, conflict management, and communication.

OPERATIONAL DECISION MAKING

Operational performance is imperative for the continued success of organisations. This module looks at data management and effective decision making to support employee engagement and provide a motivational environment. The aim of this module is for you to be able to define decision making models and their contribution to managing data, ensuring they contribute to effective operational management. You will apply different communication methods, making sense of the implications of a variety of theories and their contribution to success or failure. You will explore how you can create a motivated workforce who are committed to the organisation, and are self-critical in their practices and procedures, to move the business forward in a competitive market.

CORPORATE STRATEGY IN ACTION

This module draws from concepts of strategy to analyse real-world concepts, important for leadership and management decision making. It will explore strategic theories and models, utilising the analytical tools of PESTLE and SWOT, and explaining their significance in supporting corporate strategy.

The module develops the techniques required to analyse the macroeconomic, microeconomic and strategic business environment. It will cover a range of strategy topics, theories and models related to the analysis of the environment of organisations, the evaluation of business- and corporate-level strategies and the performance evaluation of the firm.

DIGITAL INNOVATION

Successful organisations are investigated in this module to understand how their visionary approach, embedding innovation and e-business practices satisfy changing markets and ensure future sustainability and success.

You will gain an understanding of how these organisations make use of innovation and entrepreneurship to achieve strong market positions and sustainable futures, with particular reference to organisations that thrive through the innovative use of technology.

EXTENDED PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

This module is based in the workplace, and will enable you to make use of reflective practice to critically analyse workplace environments. This experience provides an opportunity to explore real life leadership and management issues in a deep systematic way.

The module will encourage you to develop your transferable and employability skills, and apply many of the programme's concepts to your day to day role. It will also enable you to extensively reflect on your practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


To apply, you will need to evidence where you have taken responsibility to deliver long-term organisational success.

You will be expected to hold relevant Level 3 qualifications, however prior experience may also be considered. You should also have achieved qualifications in English and mathematics at a minimum of Level 2 or equivalent, and be able to demonstrate ICT skills at this level. If you have not yet achieved these qualifications, you must do so by the end of the course.

For experienced managers, this degree apprenticeship offers a 'Fast Track' route by accrediting prior experiential learning (APEL) against our foundation degree, meaning that your studies can develop from your existing knowledge and skills, and allow you to start at Level 6 to complete the programme over two years of part-time study.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT PROGRESSION


