The University of Plymouth is renowned for high quality, internationally-leading education, research and innovation.

With a mission to Advance Knowledge and Transform Lives, Plymouth is a *top 50 research university with clusters of world class research across a wide range of disciplines, including marine science and engineering, medicine, cybersecurity and psychology. A three-time winner of the Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education, the university is ranked one of the top 25 institutions globally for sustainable development and 1st in the world for the quality of its marine research and teaching.**

Plymouth has a strong track record for teaching and learning excellence, and has one of the highest numbers of National Teaching Fellows of any UK university.

As a UCSD student on a University of Plymouth course, you are part of a wider community of 7,300 students studying off campus at one of 28 partner institutions.

UCSD is a member of the university's partner college network, bringing university-level courses to students across the UK and overseas. The partnership works closely with employers to develop degrees and other higher-level qualifications designed to increase student employment and career progression prospects.

Our higher education courses are awarded by the University and our foundation degrees usually have at least one built-in progression route to an honours degree (often one-year courses are available at the university, or in some cases, another institution).

It's important to know that the deadline for applications is 25th January 2023, and places may be subject to availability. If you are progressing to the University of Plymouth, please check the fees with the university as these will be different from your current fees.

As a partner college student, you can access the university's online services, library, electronic resources and learning support materials through its web-based student portal (including access to the Careers Service online careers information (myCareer)). You can link in with the Students' Union (UPSU) and access sports clubs, societies, the advice service, volunteering opportunities, student representation, and university sports facilities.

YOUR QUALIFICATION EXPLAINED

7

HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE [HNC]- LEVEL 4

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) are vocational qualifications designed to develop practical and theoretical skills and knowledge. They focus on equipping you with a practical understanding of your chosen subject and can lead directly to employment in specific industries. They may also count towards membership of professional bodies and other employer organisations. After successfully completing your HNC, you can progress onto the related foundation degrees at UCSD.

FOUNDATION DEGREE [FDA AND FDSC]- LEVEL 5

A foundation degree is a degree-level qualification that takes two years to complete, and is equivalent to the first two years of a traditional honours degree. Foundation degrees focus on relevant, work-based skills within a particular career route or profession, and are designed to increase employability and progression opportunities.

More and more people are recognising that foundation degrees are one of the quickest and most direct routes to the high-level vocational skills required in the working world. Because employers are involved in the development of foundation degree programmes, they ensure you're ready for employment when you complete your studies.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE (BA [HONS] AND BSC [HONS])- LEVEL 6

At the end of a foundation degree, you have the option to 'top-up' your qualification with a third year of study to convert it into a full honours degree. We offer a range of bachelor's top-up courses for you to consider, or you may be able to progress to the University of Plymouth where you'll be guaranteed an interview for an associated top-up course. Please note, there's a deadline for progression applications and places may be subject to availability.

A bachelor's degree introduces you to new skills and research methods that employers will value, and is widely seen as a mark of intellectual and academic ability and potential in the employment market.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We consider a variety of qualifications and relevant experience, and assess every application on its own merit. So, even if you don't meet the specified requirements, you may still be able to study with us.

BACHELOR'S DEGREES AND TOP-UP PROGRAMMES

To progress to a top-up bachelor's degree programme, you'll need 240 credits from a foundation degree or higher national diploma in a relevant subject area.

FOUNDATION DEGREE

As a guide, to receive an offer for a foundation degree, you'll require a minimum of 48 UCAS points*. These points can be gained from A Levels, BTEC Nationals, Access to Higher Education Diplomas and equivalent qualifications. You'll also require GCSE English at Grade 4/C and (Level 2) maths.

RECOGNISING PRIOR LEARNING

We welcome applications from students of all ages, regardless of previous academic achievements. We assess each student's suitability individually and take into account previous experience.

This is why we give you the opportunity to use all of your prior learning and experience when you apply for a course. You can show this through statements from employers, personal development plans, and reflective commentaries.

So, if you don't have the formal accreditation or qualifications required, but do have relevant past experience, you could still be accepted onto your chosen degree.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION AND RETURN TO LEARN

If you don't feel quite ready for university study, an Access to Higher Education course may be perfect for you. These are intensive, one-year programmes that are designed to prepare you for studying at university level.

They can also update your academic skills if you're returning to education, and provide the opportunity to fill any gaps in your application, such as retaking English and maths GCSEs if you didn't originally achieve a 4/C or higher.

Return to Learn courses take slightly less time to complete, and are suitable for adults returning to education after an extended period of time. They're designed to build your confidence and reintroduce you to academic study in a manageable and achievable way.

This will prepare you for an Access to Higher Education course and, subsequently, university study. If you are starting a course in 2023, the UCAS entry criteria are:

FUNDING AND FEES

Studying for a university degree doesn't have to be a financially daunting prospect. Our degrees are affordable but still offer first-class facilities and teaching, helping you to gain a prestigious degree and save money at the same time.

We offer various bursary packages, as well as the full package of loan funding available from Student Finance England, so you can be comfortable with your decision to study with us.

BURSARIES

We're committed to supporting our university students with a number of bursary packages, which you'll receive if you meet particular criteria. Bursaries, which are not repaid, are awarded in addition to any grants, loans or funding received through Student Finance England.

You could be eligible to receive up to £1,000 bursary in your first year of study with us. This comprises a £200 UCSD bursary (with the exception of students undertaking a Higher or Degree Apprenticeship) when you start your studies and an additional bursary of £800, depending on your personal circumstances.

To receive an additional bursary you'll need to accept UCSD as your firm offer, and make a bursary application with us directly. For more information and to see if you are eligible, visit ucsd.ac.uk/student-life/funding-finance-and-bursaries.

TUITION FEES

You're not expected to pay for your tuition immediately. Instead, your tuition is covered by a fee loan, which is paid directly to us on your behalf by Student Finance England. You'll only be expected to begin repaying this loan when you've completed your studies and are earning over £27,295 per year.

Fees for students joining us in 2023 are currently under review, but as a guide, our tuition fees for full-time students in 2022/23 started at £8,400 per year (individual course fees can be found on our website).

Please note that if you're progressing to study at the University of Plymouth after successfully completing a course with us, the fees for the course you are progressing to will be different.

MAINTENANCE LOAN

The maintenance loan is intended to help you with living costs during your studies. The basic rate of maintenance loan doesn't depend on your household income, unless you apply for more. The loan has to be paid back but not until your income is over £27,295 a year. The maximum loan available for students (living away from home and studying outside of London) in 2022/23 was up to £9,706 per academic year. For those living in the parental home during their studies it was £8,171*.

DISABLED STUDENTS' ALLOWANCES

Disabled Students' Allowances (DSAs) are available to students who require extra support as a direct result of a disability. This includes a mental health condition or specific learning difficulty, such as dyslexia or dyspraxia. DSAs do not depend on household income.

CHILDCARE FUNDING

This helps with childcare costs for students with dependent children in registered or approved childcare. The children must be aged under 15 at the beginning of the academic year. Depending on household income, you can apply for 85% of your actual childcare costs during term times and holidays.

PARENTS' LEARNING ALLOWANCES

Parents' Learning Allowances (PLAs) help with course-related costs if you have dependent children.

REPAYMENTS

You won't repay your fee or maintenance loan until you're earning more than £27,295 per year*. If you're earning less than this you won't need to pay anything. Repayments begin in the April after you graduate, but only if you meet the financial criteria.

Repayments are charged at a rate of 9% of any additional salary over the £27,295 threshold. Interest is charged from the day the first payment is made to you until the loan is repaid or written off. Any loan remaining after 30 years is written off entirely.

For example, if you're earning £2,310 per month before tax, you'll repay £3 a month. This is because £2,310 is £36 above the monthly threshold of £2,274, and 9% of £36 is £3 (rounded down to the nearest pound).

The table below is a useful reference to see how much you can expect to repay on various incomes.

APPLYING FOR STUDENT FINANCE

WINTER 2022

Find out how much funding you're eligible for by using the student finance calculator at gov.uk/student-finance-calculator.

EARLY 2023

Apply for student finance online at gov.uk/studentfinance. You don't need to have accepted a place to apply.

SPRING 2023

Make sure you apply for student finance before the deadline in May to ensure you receive your funding at the start of the term.

SUMMER 2023

You'll receive a student finance entitlement letter that details what finance you'll get. Sign this and return your student finance declaration form.

SEPTEMBER 2023

Begin your studies and register your student finance with us- you'll receive a payment on confirmation of your attendance.

HOW TO **APPLY**

1

Decide on your preferred course (visit ucsd.ac.uk to browse our courses).

2

Register with UCAS, look for University Centre South Devon, and complete your application form at ucas.com or contact us directly.

3

From January 2023 you'll be informed of our decision. Some applicants may need to attend an interview prior to a formal offer being made.

4

Apply for student finance. You don't need to have accepted an offer to apply, and the earlier you can do this, the better.

5

We'll invite you to attend an 'Applicant Event'. This will give you the opportunity to experience UCSD before you start.

6

Once you have your results you'll need to send a copy of your certificates to the admissions office. You'll then receive a letter notifying you of our decision. This will also be available to view through the UCAS website.

Now you can celebrate. All you need to do is prepare and look forward to becoming a student at UCSD in September.

YOUR APPLICATION

At UCSD, we want to make sure the process for applying is as smooth as possible for you. Admissions decisions are made by our dedicated admission team, whose job is to make fair and consistent decisions, reading and assessing each application in full. To provide the best possible service to you, you can get in touch with our team at any time.

YOUR PERSONAL STATEMENT

Your personal statement is an important opportunity for you to let us know more about you and why you've chosen your course of study. Our admission team will read your personal statement in detail, so it's important you demonstrate to us why you're interested in your course as well as the skills you've gained to help you to succeed. The course descriptions on our website (ucsd.ac.uk), which tell you what the course is about and what it includes, may help you decide what you want to write about and give you some inspiration to explore your chosen subject further.

FULL-TIME COURSES

The application deadline for full-time courses is 25th January 2023. If you miss this, you can still apply until June 2023 through UCAS Extra, or later through Clearing, although you may not be guaranteed a place. You can apply for up to five different courses in your UCAS application.

PART-TIME AND HIGHER APPRENTICESHIP COURSES

Applications for part-time and higher apprenticeship courses are handled differently to full-time ones, and are not made through UCAS. All applications for part-time courses should be made directly to UCSD by contacting the team on **08000 21 31 81** or emailing university@southdevon.ac.uk.


